TIME COMMITMENTS

Programmers are required to attend regular team meetings and screenings as well as additional time for film festival research, report writing and film content viewing to be assigned weekly.

The time commitment is more significant for Feature Programmers who will watch around 5 feature films per week.

The role begins in early September until February.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist the Program Director in selecting and curating films for the festival.
- Research potential films for the program and complete Festival Profile Reports.
- Individually watch and analyse films for consideration and complete related reporting of ratings and analysis.
- Attend group screenings and programming meetings.
- Contribute to writing promotional copy for the festival programme (film synopsis, media quotes, film information, etc.)

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Extensive film knowledge and film analysis skills.
- Outstanding written and verbal communication skills.
- Excellent research and organization skills with an ability to meet deadlines.
- A keen interest in film, film festivals, Human Rights and global issues.

PRACTICALITIES

This is a volunteer role, however a highly rewarding one. The successful applicants will gain invaluable practical experience and ultimately contribute to the dynamic and creative film programme.
